

IGNITE THE CHURCH CONFERENCE

Tom Accola, Gabriele DiTota, and Pastor David Trexler, joined 70 church leaders from 20 states at a February 3-day "Ignite the Church" conference at Spirit of Joy Lutheran Church in Orlando. Ignite the Church is an annual gathering that, in the bold spirit of Martin Luther, seeks to further Kingdom-impacting conversation among leaders that will ignite the Church and help it live out its heritage of renewal in the years ahead! Key takeaways for our attendees:



"The conferences never answer all our questions, but they prepare and help us to do ministry. Now, as Christ's disciples, how do we process what we heard or learned? Church is not easy, yet we know the message of Jesus is our purpose and worth His promises. What is our vision? What is our purpose?"

"With an older congregation in an area that is rapidly expanding with working singles/families and new retirees, we have a few pitfalls and boundless opportunities before us. Will we allow the limitations to constrain our expectations or will we reach beyond them to a more ambitious vision?"

"We need to understand exactly what we perceive to be God's purpose for us in our corner of Palm Bay. We also need to build consensus for that vision. I am excited for the future. It is not easy to grow the church younger. We can hardly afford to alienate folks, however... it's time to invest in our church. There are many with a heart for Jesus... who will join with us?"

The Food Pantry is under "New Management"

The Food Pantry was closed for several weeks, but reopened on April 28th under the direction of Lori Search.

Lori has helped with our Pantry ministry from the very beginning. Lori volunteers every week at Second Harvest Food Bank and is able to get us many donations in exchange for her time. She has also been able to get free produce, purchase meat and has promised to spend our funds wisely. Lori gets us donations from WaWa, who works with the Food Donation Connection Program, each week as well.



We have opened gradually, but have already served 125 households in 10 hours. That is approximately 125 boxes of non-perishables and 625 lbs. of meat. The pantry is open every Tuesday 9am -11am and Thursday 5pm -7pm. We make sure to have on our masks and gloves, and we require masks on the clients; allowing only one client at a time to enter, while the food stations are spread out. It's a quick in one door and out another.

We re-opened with a STRONG group of volunteers. Some have been faithfully helping out for 2 years. The majority of the group are retired men and they are so helpful with lifting, setting up and tearing down the pantry. The shelves are stocked, boxes packed, and food is passed out. They are friendly and greet the clients and seem to just know what needs to be done and when. Things just seem to flow. There are no "slackers" in this bunch. We are so thankful for them.

Please, remember that God has been helping us in so many ways to provide for our community through the Food Pantry ministry. It will soon be 7 years since we first started to give out more than an occasional bag or two from the church office. Your gifts make it possible. We pay only 20 cents a pound to Second Harvest. Imagine what your dollar can provide for a household with 5 lbs. of meat. Thanking you in advance, as God blesses you in a way you can bless others.



A huge "Thank You" goes out to **Danielle Shwiner**, for her faithful and continuous dedication to our Food Pantry for nearly 6 1/2 years. She and her family were a part of this ministry from the very early days, when it was a very small operation, housed in the original church office/nursery.

Danielle has a big servant's heart and she helped Peace provide food to thousands in need over the years.

CDC Guidance for Faith Based Organizations

Prior to resuming Sunday services on May 17, PLC leadership carefully reviewed current Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidance for faith based organizations. We measured our sanctuary, determining that we can safely accommodate approx. 60 worshippers. We also temporarily removed communion, passing the peace, and passing offering plates from our services. Here are CDC common prevention tips to help stop the spread of COVID-19 as we worship together:

- Maintain good hand hygiene, washing hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol, tissues, and no-touch trash cans.
- Cover coughs and sneezes with a tissue or use the inside of your elbow. Throw used tissues in a no-touch trash can.
- Face coverings are meant to protect other people in case the wearer is unknowingly infected but does not have symptoms.
- Do not place protective masks on anyone who has trouble breathing or is unconscious, or anyone who is incapacitated or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

Treasurer's Report

Dear Members and Friends of Peace Lutheran Church,

Whoops! Last month I reported that we will have property taxes due in May. I meant property insurance. (Past Treasurer, Brent Doyle, pointed that out to me.) The property insurance bill did arrived the end of May. The total bill is \$15,814.94 with a down payment of \$3,716.52 and 10 payments of \$1,262.44. This includes a finance fee of \$483.63 because we can't pay this all at once.

It looks like we are doing OK financially at the end of April. A little over budget in income and under budget in expenses. I wish I could promise that every month. Under the circumstances that is good. Say a prayer that this report will remain on a positive note.

I also want to say that the sanctuary pews (wood parts), doors and other handles are being wiped down between services, the AC is low and the fans are on to circulate air, no one is shaking hands or sharing the peace of the Lord, and we have plenty of hand sanitizer to make everyone feel confident that it's safe to come back to service. Many of us wear masks (I know it's uncomfortable) and we sit at least 6 feet apart to make everyone feel safe. I feel this is a small act we can do to show how much we care for one another. I would hate to lose any one of you because we failed to follow recommended safety guidelines. Sadly, there are members who have lost relatives to COVID-19 and our hearts and prayers go out to them.

Please, if you have a complaint or a concern regarding this information or other church topics, please call or email. I come to church to worship and when someone has a complaint 15 minutes before service it sometimes does ruin the service for me.

My trust is in God to see us through this crisis and strengthen our faith. Keep Peace Lutheran Church's brothers and sisters in Christ in your prayers.


