Dear Friends through Christ:

Allow me to update all our Saints and Sinners with a few things happening at Peace Lutheran Church, during our slow time of summer. The carpet has been ordered. We've begun work on the sound system and the not so pretty sound booth will be removed. The sound will now

be run from the choir area where we can utilize all our mics and speakers. Yeah! Praise the Lord!

Speaking of sound, I am working closely with Lorry, Sally and Beverly trying to blend a style of up-beat relevant liturgy and incorporate a few of the classic hymns that have been around for 2-400 years, while trying to maintain a modern sound. I realize to some the word "liturgy" has a bad ring, but do you realize that liturgy simply means "the work of the people." Worship is corporate where we all have a role and our liturgy gives us a type of back and forth dialogue through Scripture. There are some wonderful modern day writers and musicians who have developed beautiful music, using all the instruments. We still need people to volunteer their gifts of music and perhaps there is someone out there that plays a Bass or Drums or whatever. In the meantime, our worship committee feels a new way of worshipping will not only be fun to learn, but will enhance our experience with the Lord and one another. Yeah! Praise the Lord!

Peace Place is moving right along and hope to complete by the end of July, transforming an ugly duckling to a beautiful event center. But even before Peace Place is finished, a Pastor Chip Davis from "In Season Ministry" approached me just last week. In Season Ministry previously worshipped around 35-40 at 2542 S Harbor City Blvd. in Melbourne. The owner of the space they leased for years decided to sell and now these thirty-five or so saints and sinners have no place to worship. They will donate \$800 per month to call Peace Place home. They will have access to Peace place beginning on Sunday July 7—Sunday School is at 9:30 AM and worship at 12:00PM. Details will be needed to work through council, but until then they have a place to gather. Yeah! Praise the Lord!

In our May newsletter, I mentioned that Dr. Kilday and Dr. Mair were interested in starting a "Holistic Health Center." This proposal has been approved by council and contracts have been signed. They will pay \$750 per month. The Holistic Health Center" will open on July 1, 2019, located next to the food pantry. They have developed an eight month drug rehabilitation program with a proclaimed success rate of 80%, using a spiritual and nutritional approach. Dr. Kilday and Dr. Mair also specialize in using proven natural solutions to fight cancer and other chronic diseases. However, what excited me personally is their mission "to promote healthy body, mind and spirit" using all natural supplements and herbs, not just treating sicknesses but preventing a person from becoming sick. Pretty cool, uh? I suggest you give them a try. Again, they are located next to the food pantry. Yeah! Praise the Lord!

Speaking of the food pantry, we were graciously donated a mini-van, thanks to Lori Search's effort. Smaller than, newer than, and more efficient than our "monster truck." Again thanks to Lori, because she turned around and sold the nightmare truck for around \$3000. Yeah! Praise the Lord!

I also want to give a big shout out to the ladies who helped put together the Prayer Sister Tea and the Memorial for Vicki McKeny. Prayer and service are the vital elements of any church. There were 25 female saints and sinners at the tea, and 38 have signed to pray for a particular person and share moments of joy and sadness with their prayer sister. "A bridge to Jesus for our youth in the community"

Then Jesus said, "Let's go off by ourselves to a quiet place and rest awhile." He said this because there were so many people coming and going that Jesus and his apostles didn't even have time to eat. Mark 6:31(NLT)



The Christian League Youth Group is exploring this month about what it feels like to be harried; to see the accumulation of half-completed chores and unfinished projects pile up at home, at school, or at work while we try to get a handle on another day's demands: homework, laundry, meals, sports, music lessons, volunteer activities, exercise, and on and on. If you're like us you are always longing for that "light at the end of the tunnel" when the calendar will be cleared, the chores done, the "to-do" list will be completed, and there will be space for one huge sigh, a day to kick-back and to savor life.

In *The Fiddler on the Roof*, Tevye the milkman sings about how he would use that "down" time, a time he imagines would surely be his, if only he "were a rich man." The sweetest thing of all, he says, would be studying "the holy books with the learned men seven hours every day." We all have dreams about how we would use our time if we only had the time. The point, of course, is what we choose to do now with the time that we have; how we pattern our lives now, not in some imagined world that, in reality, we will never realize.

When the apostles returned from the missionary journey on which Jesus had sent them, they were full of stories and experiences they wanted to share about what they had seen and done and taught. Mark tells us that their ministries met with some success. Jesus was well aware of the demands of ministry, and how their enthusiasm and growth had to be matched with time away, time to unwind, to reflect, and to receive. The journey onto which he had invited them, after all, was not a sprint but a marathon. So, after he listened to all they had to share, he invited them to "come away and rest a while." It is a pattern into which he invites us as well.

One of the great gifts from the tradition of our Jewish forbearers is the Sabbath. A day each week of community supported down time, a pattern whose origin the tradition traces back to the very beginning of creation and God's own actions. (Genesis 1). Sabbath is a time for resting, a time for rekindling our spiritual life, reconnecting with family, giving rest to beasts of burden, being restored through a rhythm that will enable life to carry on for the long haul. In our chronically overworked society, Sabbath time must seem to most of us like a distant dream, yet the fact is for century upon century real people in real life have practiced that tradition. Maybe it's time to take it back.

This summer, the Christian League Youth Group is examining our own patterns to carve out concentrated "sabbath" time. We're taking opportunities for self-assessment in how we share this ministry and in how our service is helping His mission. Whatever your plans are these two months, we hope that you, too, will take time to heed Jesus' call to "come away and rest for a while." Most of us find that it's often during the time away that the things that have been hazy in my life, the question marks, the puzzles, become clarified. We pray the same for you. May God grant you refreshment this summer, whether you are home or away, whether we meet at the Lord's Table, at a fellowship event, or in a place beyond. May God's deep peace inhabit your soul.

Treasurer's Report—MAY 2019

Dear Members and Friends of Peace Lutheran Church,

The good news for the end of May is that we above budget in contribution and below budget in expenses. Where we are falling short is in our Use of Facilities. We will soon be renting out the space to Holistic Health Center. They will occupy the clinic space in July. Pray their business succeeds.

In May we had a property insurance bill of \$2,786.44 and will continue to pay a monthly insurance payments of over \$1,000 for the next 11 months.

We sent a check to Brevard Children Hunger Program in the amount of \$2,400. Your generosity will be greatly appreciated by the program.

Through the noisy offering we received the defibrillator and some people from each service were trained to use if there is a need. Thank you to Scott Shiener for the excellent training.

Through the noisy offering we raised \$206.16 for the benefit of LCMC benevolence.

We also paid for the Peace Place air conditioner in the amount of \$14,900.

\$57,500 of the \$100,000 we received on May 1st was moved into savings. This money isn't considered as income and is not reflected in the chart above. As of the end of May we had \$37,075.58 in checking and \$66,317.54 in savings. Those amounts will diminish as we pay for the update on Peace Place, new carpeting and sound systems for the sanctuary.

I want to thank the Pastor, staff and the council for their support in trying to keep to our budget.

Continue praying for Peace Lutheran of Palm Bay, our ministries, and your faithful treasurer.


