Healing in His Wings

Psalm 91:1-4 (NKJV)

He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High Shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD, "He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust." Surely He shall deliver you from the snare of the fowler and from the perilous pestilence. He shall cover you with His feathers, and under His wings you shall take refuge; His truth shall be your shield and buckler.



This last month has been very difficult for many of us. It is like being on a rough ride and not sure when it might be over. We all go through time in our life when we have uncertainties. It is how we respond to them that shows who we are. But I find that in every challenge there are lessons to be learned, obstacles we need to overcome and perhaps some course corrections that may need to be made.

The most important thing we must do is, not shrink from the adjustment that need to be made. Because it is in how we move forward that brings stability and confidence that we are one and can weather any storm together.

First, we must seek God's plan and have confidence that it is His plan. How do we do that? I can give you 4 easy steps to follow to hear Him and to know it is Him:

- 1. Sit quietly and focus on Jesus. Take a picture of Him and look at His image. Try to shut out the world.
- 2. Ask Jesus. What would you say to me?
- 3. Write down what you hear. Don't worry about spelling or correctness, just write as if you are taking notes from an instructor.
- 4. Last, take your notes and read them to someone you have confidence in that is strong in faith. You may also want to do this in a trusted group and have everyone read what they wrote.

Do not try to correct it or rewrite. Some of what you wrote may not make sense to you right now, or in a group, but it may make sense to someone else.

I will stand my watch and set myself on the rampart, and watch to see what He will say to me, and what I will answer when I am corrected. Then the LORD answered me and said: "Write the vision and make *it* plain on tablets, that he may run who reads it.

Just try it!!

Do you live your life as if Easter is an unparalleled victory?

It was May Day, 1990. The place, Moscow's Red Square. "Is it straight, Father?" one Orthodox priest asked another as he shifted a heavy, eight-foot crucifix on his shoulder. "Yes," said the other. "It is straight." Together the two priests, along with a group of parishioners holding ropes that steadied the beams of the huge cross, walked the parade route. It was May Day in Moscow, the celebration of the communist takeover of the Soviet Union. In front of these priests passed the usual May


Day procession of tanks, missiles, troops, and salutes to the Communist party elite. Behind the tanks surged a giant crowd of protesters, shouting up at Mikhail Gorbachev. "Bread! . . . Freedom! . . . Truth!" As the throng passed directly in front of the Soviet leader standing in his place of honor, the priests hoisted their heavy burden toward the sky. The cross emerged from the crowd. As it did, the figure of Jesus Christ obscured the giant poster faces of Marx, Engels, and Lenin that provided the backdrop for Gorbachev's reviewing stand. "Mikhail Sergeyevich!" one of the priests shouted, his deep voice cleaving the clamor of the protesters and piercing straight toward the angry Soviet leader. "Mikhail Sergeyevich! Christ is risen!" Those humble priests wanted Gorbachev to know that dictators come and go, mighty nations come and go, atheistic philosophies come and go, but Jesus Christ is alive today, tomorrow and even forever. Easter is a historical event, but it is more than that. It is an unparalleled victory over sin and death. Christ lives!

But one thing more. Easter is about living the resurrected life here and now. It is not about the future alone. It is about today! In Philip Yancey's book, "I WAS JUST WONDERING," he tries to imagine a society in which no one believed in an afterlife. What would the world look like if no one believed that there was a heaven or a hell? Yancey gave his fictitious land the name of Acirema. These are just a few of the characteristics his imaginary Aciremans would have: Aciremans would put great emphasis on youth. The idea of growing old and eventually dying would be so traumatic that they could have no hope for the future. Therefore, preserving their youth would become an obsession. Old age, and anything associated with aging, would be shunned and devalued. In this way, the rest of society could continue the charade of denying the facts of aging. Every kind of cosmetic and chemical treatment that can possibly slow down the aging process would be necessary. Appearances would be all that matter. Inner beauty, characterized by such things as integrity, compassion, and decorum, would no longer matter. People who do not look attractive, young, and healthy would face great discrimination. Scientists would try to figure out how to eliminate death. People would use all kinds of euphemisms to say that someone has died. Religion for the Aciremans would consist of philosophies to help them make the most of here and now. Eternal rewards wouldn't exist in their belief system, so Acireman religion would teach that one must be fully gratified and rewarded in this lifetime. Therefore, Aciremans would be taught to "grab all the gusto they can get," to build up riches and satisfy their whims and desires as soon as they can. Sound familiar to anyone? The fact the word Acirema spelled backwards is America might give you a hint.

Does Easter have anything to say to our lives here and now? It sure does. Because Christ lives, we can face life courageously. Because Christ lives, we can face death confidently. Because Christ lives, we can live committed and consecrated lives. Because Christ lives, we have a hope that never fails.

What an unparalleled victory to live your life in! God's peace and abundant love be with you,

Treasurer's Corner

With the cold months of January and February behind us, we now look forward to the warmer months and increased reliance on Air Conditioning. February was one of the least expensive electricity months I have seen since I took over this position. February's electric bill was less than \$370. That was due to the rather cooler temperatures and tax savings due to the work that our contractor Audit Associates have done for us in eliminating taxes. I suspect that some of that savings will continue due to the more efficient air conditioner we installed in Fellowship Hall. However, as expected March's bill jumped to \$600.

We continue to work with Audit Associates to eliminate taxes we shouldn't have been charged over the years. So far they have resolved issues with Palm Bay Utilities, Brighthouse, FPL and are in the final stages with AT&T. In most cases we were able to ecoup

some of those taxes and in all cases eliminated them all together.

We were bequeathed a sum of money from the estate of Pearl Reid this month. Council will determine where we will use or save this. Pearl was an active member up until the ELCA split where she transferred to Joy Lutheran Church. It was nice to see that she still had Peace in her thoughts. Pastor Dan and I visited Pearl at the Life Care Center of Palm Bay during her last few months of life.

As we look forward to spring and summer we are reminded that it is time for our snow birds to take wing once again. We wish them well on their summer retreats and anxiously await their return in the fall. Please return safety to your friends here at Peace.




